Introductions & Healthy Happenings	<p>Molly Marshall, Purdue Extension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ServSafe classes are not happening in person right now. • With gatherings/parties happening again, Purdue Extension has a resource called Party Food Safety Zone available on Facebook. • United Way continues to discuss food insecurity issues on monthly calls. <p>John Doriot, SMC Nutrition Services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 3 patients were referred for their frozen meal program in May. • Frozen meals that are nearing expiration date are donated to The Alley. • Nutrition services are increasing at SMC with more patients coming in. <p>Melanie O’Neal, Arc & Mental Health America Jackson County</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community Foundation helped provide hand sanitizer at group homes. Were also able to recently order face masks and face shields. • Suicide Prevention Coalition is working on a toolkit. • Mental Health America rack card was translated to Spanish and distributed throughout the community. <p>Shannon Hunsucker, Medora Community Schools</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medora School Food Pantry has monthly distributions • A Little Food Pantry is also available at White River Ag but there is not a lot of activity there. Feels we need to raise awareness in the community about this. • Meals are also delivered to students on a bus route in the summer. Student meals are free; adult meals are \$3. 	

	<p>Ginger Schneck, Girls Inc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Summer camp opened on June 15 limited to 100 participants. Classes will remain together all day, and lunches will be brought to each classroom. All staff members are returning from last summer and have received training in proper PPE, seating arrangements, handwashing, etc. due to COVID-19 concerns. • Youth mental health has been a discussion on United Way calls. Hopeful that camp helps improve some mental health concerns. • After-school program is TBD. <p>Becky Voelz, Gleaners</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinating monthly drive through pantries with Megan Cherry (Anchor House) at Cummins parking lot.
<p>Old Business</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Medora School-Based Food Pantry Update 2. Webpage and Toolkit 	<p>Medora Food Pantry has had 4 distributions thus far. Distributions have been a drive through since COVID-19 pandemic started with boxes donated by Rose Acres. Volunteers are limited to what is absolutely necessary to run the pantry. 80 families were served in April, and 100 families in May. Please help share that these are available:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boys & Girls Club of Seymour – 950 North O'Brien Street, Seymour, IN 47274 • Tampico Church – 5626 South State Road 39, Brownstown, IN 47320 (visible from the road and located near the steps by the entrance to the building) • White River AG Sales – 2858 IN-235, Medora, IN 47260 <p>A total of 1,012 lbs. of food has been donated through the Community Food Drive. These donations have been distributed to pantries throughout the county. Donations have slowed down which is common during the summer months. Plan to keep donation bins out at the Schneck Foundation and Immanuel Lutheran Church but will not do a big social media push until August for donations.</p> <p>Megan shared via e-mail that the Leadership Jackson County food pantry network plans to meet in July.
